I WOULD LIKE TO SHARE WITH YOU POPE BENEDICT'S REFLECTION FOR THIS SUNDAY:

"The question that Jesus puts to the Samaritan woman: "Give me a drink" (*Jn 4: 7*), is presented to us in the liturgy of the third Sunday; it expresses the passion of God for every man and woman, and wishes to awaken in our hearts the desire for the gift of "a spring of water within, welling up for eternal life" (*Jn 4: 14*): this is the gift of the Holy Spirit, who transforms Christians into "true worshipers," capable of praying to the Father "in spirit and truth" (*Jn 4: 23*). Only this water can extinguish our thirst for goodness, truth and beauty! Only this water, given to us by the Son, can irrigate the deserts of our restless and unsatisfied soul, until it "finds rest in God", as per the famous words of St. Augustine."

It seems so long since we used the word, "Cluster". In fact, it has hardly surfaced since September, 2008, when we submitted the merger proposal to join together Saint Gregory the Great and Saint Margaret Mary Parishes.

Fr. Winkel will continue his parish Lenten series on **Monday, March 28, at 7 p.m.** in the St. Margaret Mary Meeting Room of the rectory.

The next talk will center on the greatest struggle the Church ever faced in all of its history: **THE STRUGGLE TO KNOW JESUS**. From the time of St. Peter and St. John the Evangelist down to our present-day, man tries to explain what really is unexplainable.

Around 320 AD, a priest named Arius in Alexandria, Egypt, gave a series of talks on Jesus the Christ which shook the Christian world. "Principal's Corner"

Can you believe that we've finished our third quarter of school already? March 24th was the end of the 3rd Quarter. Students will receive their Report Cards on April 4th. Many of our students have done quite well, receiving many excellent grades. We have also completed taking the IOWA Standardized Tests and will find out the results by the end of May.

Our eighth grade students have received acceptance letters from area Catholic high schools. All 38 students were accepted into their first choice of school; 34 of them tentatively planning to attend a Catholic high school. We're so proud of them and wish them luck in their high school years. The majority of those who have chosen a Catholic high school will attend either Benedictine, Beaumont, Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin, or St. Ignatius.

On Monday and Tuesday, March 28 and 29, we will conduct a screening assessment for the incoming kindergartners. This screening will assist us in the placement of new Gr. K students. We will have no Pre-School, and no Gr. K classes those 2 days.

We will have our next couple of school Stations of the Cross on Wednesday, March 30, and Thursday, April 7 at 2 p.m. in the Church. Come and spend 15 minutes with us.
