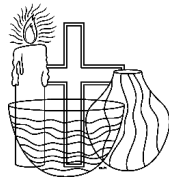

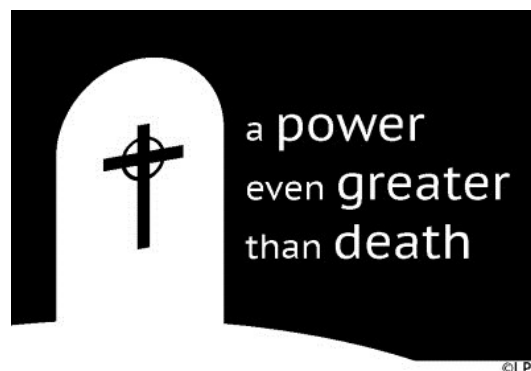

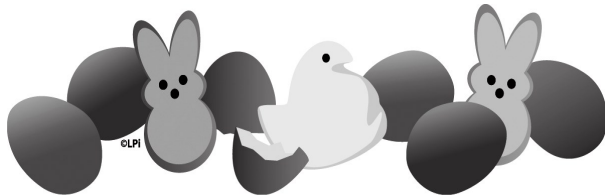

REFLECTIONS ON LIFE ... RESPECT LIFE COMMITTEE

The Gospel of Life...

"...it is necessary to recall the general principles concerning cooperation in evil actions. Christians, like all people of good will, are called upon under grave obligation of conscience not to cooperate formally in practices which, even if permitted by civil legislation, are contrary to God's law. Indeed, from the moral standpoint, it is never licit to cooperate formally in evil. Such cooperation occurs when an action, either by its very nature or by the form it takes in a concrete situation, can be defined as a direct participation in an act against innocent human life or a sharing in the immoral intention of the person committing it. This cooperation can never be justified either by invoking respect for the freedom of others or by appealing to the fact that civil law permits it or requires it. Each individual in fact has moral responsibility for the acts which he personally performs; no one can be exempted from this responsibility, and on the basis of it everyone will be judged by God himself.

To refuse to take part in committing an injustice is not only a moral duty; it is also a basic human right."

President Obama is being accused of a double cross by former Rep. Bart Stupak, a Democrat, whose crucial vote for the Obamacare was obtained after presidential promises that the public would be protected from demands for abortion funding. Stupak had opposed Obamacare because of its requirement that the public pay for abortions, but reached an agreement with President Obama that the president would sign an executive order that would exempt anyone from funding abortions. The bill signed into law by the president, nevertheless, requires employer health insurance plans to fund abortifacients and abortion. Now, in a recent editorial in USA Today, Stupak announced he's filed a brief in the U.S. Supreme Court on behalf of the Green and Hahn families, who own the Hobby Lobby and Conestoga Wood companies. Those companies are suing to not be **forced** to fund abortifacients for employees. Stupak says he likes Obamacare overall but thinks the abortion requirement is wrong, writing in USA Today that "as a private citizen, I'm proud to stand with the.... corporations, Hobby Lobby and Conestoga Wood, in seeking to uphold our most cherished beliefs that we, as American citizens, should not be required to relinquish our conscience and moral convictions in order to implement the Affordable Care Act."
