## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK ...

### *My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,*

I look forward to our continued pilgrimage together as the Parish of Sacred Heart of Jesus and was very pleased with the coverage of our merger in the **Sun Messenger**. Together, we will grow as a strong and faithful community.

The merger of St. Gregory the Great and St. Margaret Mary has resulted in the combining of our financial and business operations, in addition to our faith activities. I have met with the staff of both former parishes to discuss the best ways to move forward. The Finance Council, which advises me on financial and business matters, now includes members from both former parishes.

Financial statements of both former parishes for the year ended June, 2010, will be available to parishioners once collections and payments are finalized over the next several months. In addition, a budget for the year ending June 30, 2011, will be made available in the fall, once reliable estimates can be made of key financial elements.

The management of the St. Margaret Mary facility is a very important matter. I am consulting individuals familiar with the site, the two lessees, our staff, Financial Council members, Diocesan facilities management specialists and others to gain valuable information about managing the property. The goal is to do what is in the best interest of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish.

I will keep you advised regarding continuing merger activities throughout the next year. There is much being done to make this merger successful.

As we celebrate the Fourth of July, let us be ever mindful of our many blessings. We will have a Special Mass Monday morning, July 5, at 9 a.m. Please note the Parish Office will be closed in celebration of the holiday. I invite you to come to pray with us on the 5th and also to plan on attending our Parish Festival on July 15, 16, 17, and 18. This event is a much-needed annual fund raiser and provides many opportunities for fun and fellowship, good food and enjoyable music for young and old alike.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION ...

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

There were many little incidents that led up to the Revolutionary War. Open-ended warrants, taxation without representation, the Stamp Act requiring fees on newspapers and other printed matter, and the quartering of troops in private homes are just a few examples of actions the colonists objected to in the two decades before the start of the war. In itself, no single event is seen as the definitive cause for the revolution. But the cumulative effect of the grievances-most outlined in the Declaration of Independence-saw many in the colonies rise up against the British, whose army, once thought of as protectors, was now thought of as an occupying force. Those whom we call patriots today, were thought by some of their fellow citizens to be rabble-rousers and criminals. History has a way of sorting things out.

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends his disciples out to announce the kingdom of God. This was not a move for political power (though some saw it that way) or even for earthly success. It was not even so much a rebellion against the past as a fulfillment of promises made by God long ago. "The kingdom of God is at hand for you," the disciples proclaimed.

The message of Jesus has lasted far longer than nations or kingdoms. Christ is not allied with any government or political faction. God's kingdom exists apart from any political boundaries or human limitations. As Christians, we recognize our responsibility to seek justice and peace. Our calling is to promote the common good, even at the expense of our own self-interest. While we celebrate independence, we also understand that liberty does not mean unfettered license to do what we please. The kingdom of God is not so much a place of individual right as one of communal responsibility. And as citizens of that kingdom we submit ourselves to the law of love for God and for our neighbor.



Question: Does watching Mass on TV fulfill my Sunday obligation?

In the age of instant communication, e-mail, voice mail and teleconferencing, many people wonder if these media of communication can be used for sacraments. Many priests, I am sure, have had people ask about going to confession on the phone. While it may seem like a convenient way to do things, there are many reasons why we don't.



Watching the Mass on television can be a good thing for those who are shut-in. But it really doesn't fulfill our obligation. The obligation to attend Mass is more than just to simply listen to the Mass or to follow the prayers and the readings. Gathering together as a community of faith is important. Sacraments are community events where we encounter God and one another. When we gather together we are most visibly the church, the body of Christ. Besides, television is a one-way medium. It allows us to watch without really being able to give a response. In faith, our response is as important as anything that we hear. We need to take an active part in the religious expression of our community. The best way to do this is to participate in prayer and in song at Mass each weekend.


