FROM THE DESK OF THE SENIOR PAROCHIAL VICAR

GO GREEN!

No, that is not a cheer for some sport team. The urging to *go green* is a part of the message of those good people who look out for the environment and are encouraging us to take steps to promote lessening of pollution, sound ecology, and to help to return our world to the original condition in which the Creator gave it to the children of Adam and Eve.

Please remember (the reader has to be at least in his/her late fifties) when the slate board on which the teacher and students wrote with chalk was always colored black. When I was called by the teacher to come up to the front of the room to write with chalk on that surface, the teacher would have told me to come to "the blackboard." I doubt if there are any *blackboards* left in schools today. The wise people who wish to help students to learn in school discovered that the color green is more restful on our eyes. Different shades of the color green are often used for the walls of our classrooms, waiting rooms, reception areas, etc.

All of this is Man coming to discover what our loving Creator always knew about human beings, the crown of His creation. Almost all of the vegetation that the Father gave us is green. From magnificent trees with green leaves or needles, to the green grass in our yards, green seems to be God's favorite color. (Blue is another of His favorites.) Even to lilies which Jesus praised as an example for His disciples to have faith ~ "Solomon in all his splendor was not arrayed like any one of these (Lk 12:27) ~ even the lilies come with green stems.

In a like manner, as the Church began to designate colors for specific liturgical celebrations, she chose green as the her favorite, or at least most frequently used color. Green is the major color for the thirty-four weeks of Ordinary Time. After the violet/purple of Lent and the white vestments used in Easter Time, Holy Mother Church slipped back into Ordinary Time with her green vestments. Ordinary Time's green vestments resumed on the day after Pentecost, Monday, June 9. The Eleventh, Twelfth, and Thirteenth Sundays of Ordinary Time, however, used white and then red vestments for the Solemnities of The Most Holy Trinity, Corpus Christi, and last weekend's Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. Although four weeks of Ordinary Time have gone by since the end of Easter Time, this weekend, the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, is the first Sunday liturgy to use green vestments since March 2nd.

Ordinary Time is not Advent, Christmas, Lent or Easter Time. Ordinary Time with its easy-on-your eyes green is IN SOME WAYS the most important season on the Church's liturgical calendar. We have thirty-four weeks to show that our Holy Catholic Faith is a real and *ordinary* part of our lives. This is not "the big comeback" for Christmas or Easter. In fact, if the Catholic makes faithfulness in following Jesus a real and ordinary part of life during Ordinary Time, there is no need for some sort of comeback in Advent or Easter. In Ordinary Time, the Christian has Christ as a real and *ordinary* part of daily life. I urge all of you to GO GREEN in Ordinary Time by your faithfulness to Mass, the Sacraments, holy reading and daily prayer.

I also urge you to come to our Parish Festival that begins this coming Thursday, July 10th. You will most likely be able to find me under the big tent or wherever food is being served.

- ◆ I was kind to the younger kids I met this week.

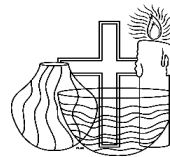
