My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are entering into the Month of the Holy Rosary and Respect Life Month. Please consider praying a rosary at least once a week as a family. Perhaps your intentions could be for peace: a great need in our world.

During this month we have so many expressions of LIFE! On Saturday we blessed our pets. Please plan on attending our stand for life. We will gather at the Lyceum at 12:45 and prepare to walk to Mayfield and Green where we will stand for one hour in a silent witness to the Sanctity of Human Life.

We will have the Anointing of the Sick at all of the Masses next weekend. Please plan on bringing any of your neighbors or family members to church for Mass. There will be special seating for the needs of those who are ill. Also this weekend, the St. Vincent de Paul Society will be conducting its Annual Blanket Sunday Collection for the needy. Details of this collection can be found elsewhere in the bulletin.

Beginning October 16th following the 8:45 Mass we will have our Annual 40 Hours Devotions. Please plan on spending at least one hour with our Lord in prayer. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on the Main Altar all day and night. We will have police present during the overnight hours.

Please plan on attending the Solemn Closing at 6 p.m. on Sunday, October 18th. We will be joined by priests and deacons from the Diocese. I would ask that there be representation from all of the groups and societies of the parish. The Eucharist is the Source and Summit of our LIFE!
