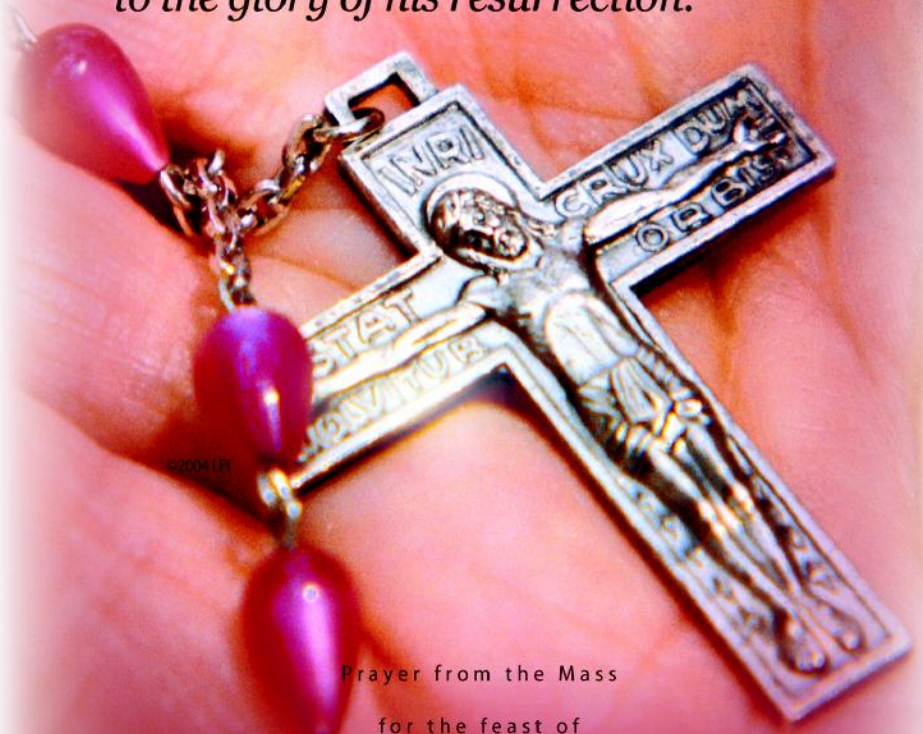

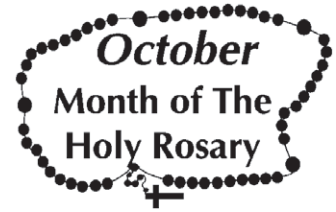
Finally, I'd like to thank everyone who offered kind thoughts and prayers on my birthday. May God bless you for your goodness.

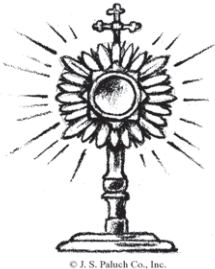

Jesus said in reply, "Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" - Lk 17:15-18

Some of the earliest lessons we teach our children are about sharing, being polite, and being grateful. It is common to hear parents ask a young child after they have been given something, "Now what do you say?" in an effort to get the child to learn to say, "Thank you." Expressing gratitude for gifts from others is what we are taught to do.

It is often said that immigrants have a greater appreciation of the opportunities of American culture and so become greater patriots. The same correlation is made about converts who are often the most devoted to their faith. Before we judge those who are not like us, it may be well to recall that they may have a greater appreciation for what they have-whether it be their place in society or their faith-because they had to reach for it like the Samaritan leper. We can all be grateful.

ST. GREGORY THE GREAT CHURCH ... SITE OF A CONCERT OF 16TH CENTURY SACRED POLYPHONY

The Mignarda lute song duo, Donna Stewart & Ron Andrico, will present a concert of 16th-century sacred polyphony arranged for solo voice and lute at 8 p.m. on Friday, October 29, in the Church of St. Gregory the Great. Co-sponsored by Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish and the Lyceum School, this concert marks the official Cleveland release of their CD, *Harmonia Caelestis*, and is an opportunity to hear a live performance of this very special music.

Donna and Ron, long-time friends of the Lyceum School, are based in the Finger Lakes area of New York but have strong Cleveland connections, having met singing the Tridentine Mass at Immaculate Conception Church.

Virtually every surviving source of lute music from the 16th century contains arrangements of sacred polyphony scattered among the dances and fantasias; and it was common practice to use the lute, with its delicate sound and portable size, in private daily devotional music. Even Palestrina was known to have worked out his masses and other compositions with lute in hand, reflecting the typical use of what has, in these times, become quite rare.

This promises to be an unforgettable evening of marvelous music for those who enjoy classical music. Please come and bring your families and friends.
