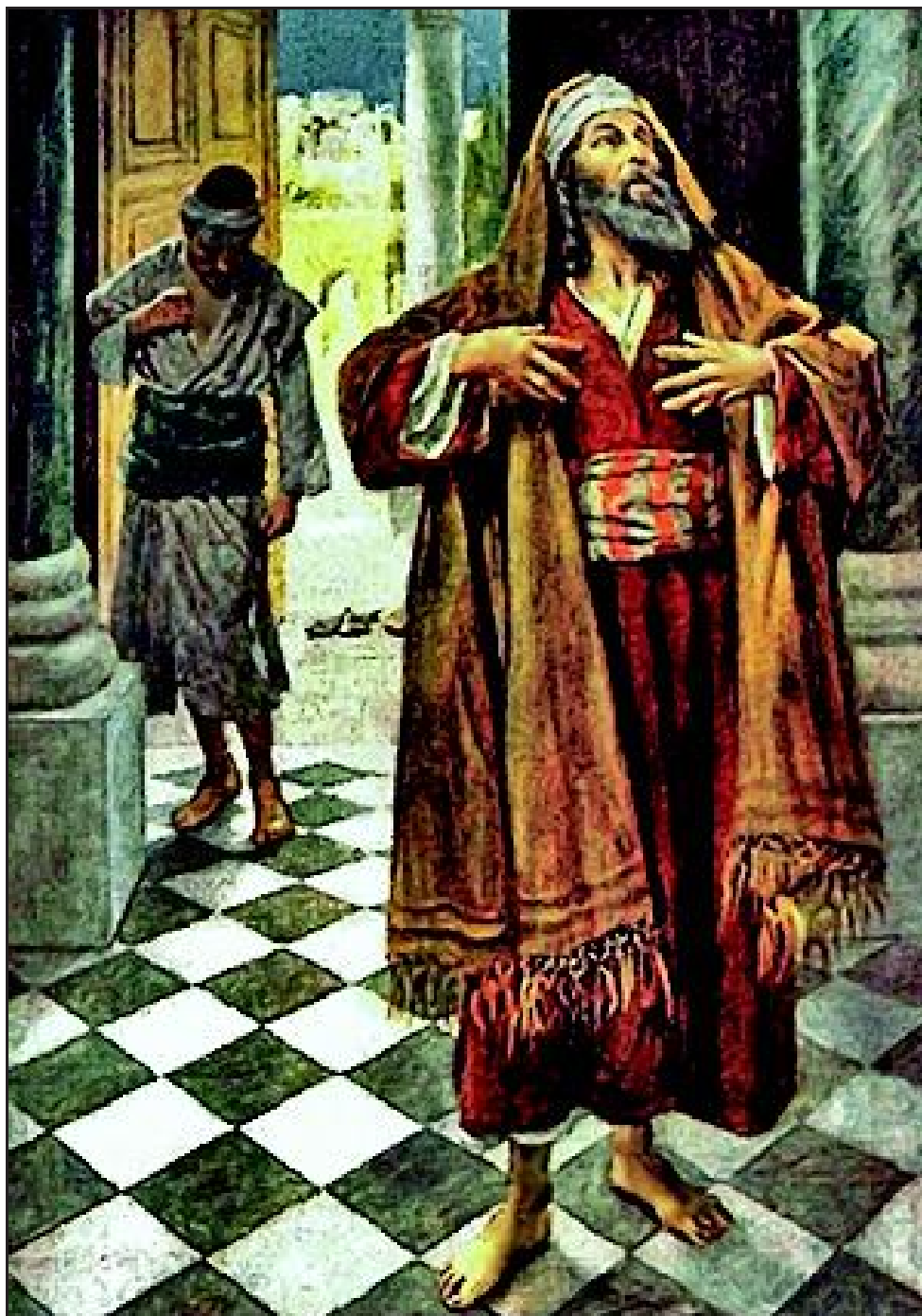

REFLECTING ON THE SCRIPTURES...



Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Self-esteem and self-promotion are generally credited as values. Psychologists and social workers often attribute difficulties in social adjustment, problems with bullying, addiction to drugs or alcohol, increased rates of teenage pregnancy and domestic abuse to low self-esteem. In the jobless culture of these difficult economic times low self-esteem can eat away at one's psychological health. As a counteractive measure, many counselors encourage the unemployed to engage in self-promotion, advertising their desirable qualities to potential employers in the same way a product might be marketed to consumers.

The Pharisee in this week's Gospel certainly has no problem with self-promotion. He is well-qualified for a position on Madison Avenue, though he would probably be hawking himself more than the products he would be trying to market. Some might see the self-deprecating tax collector as one of the down-and-out folks who is never going to make it, because he just doesn't have the verve and initiative to get out there and sell himself. An out-placement counselor might advise him to project his good points-dedicated worker, good with numbers, financially savvy, willing to take on a hard job, etc.

All of those good points may indeed be a part of the tax collector's profile. But there are other aspects of his life as well that need some work, and he is ready to acknowledge that. This is what humility really is-being honest about oneself. Self-esteem and self-promotion still have their value in a humble person. Indeed, a truly humble person needs good self-esteem to be able to examine himself or herself critically to come to an honest appraisal of virtues and shortcomings. Real humility is not about making ourselves worthless, but about developing an assessment of our true worth and the improvements we still need to make with God's help.

ST. GREGORY THE GREAT CHURCH ... SITE OF A CONCERT OF 16TH CENTURY SACRED POLYPHONY

The Mignarda lute song duo, Donna Stewart & Ron Andrico, will present a concert of 16th-century sacred polyphony arranged for solo voice and lute at 8 p.m. on Friday, October 29, in the Church of St. Gregory the Great. Co-sponsored by Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish and the Lyceum School, this concert marks the official Cleveland release of their CD, *Harmonia Caelestis*, and is an opportunity to hear a live performance of this very special music.

Donna and Ron, long-time friends of the Lyceum School, are based in the Finger Lakes area of New York but have strong Cleveland connections, having met singing the Tridentine Mass at Immaculate Conception Church.

Virtually every surviving source of lute music from the 16th century contains arrangements of sacred polyphony scattered among the dances and fantasias; and it was common practice to use the lute, with its delicate sound and portable size, in private daily devotional music. Even Palestrina was known to have worked out his masses and other compositions with lute in hand, reflecting the typical use of what has, in these times, become quite rare.

This promises to be an unforgettable evening of marvelous music for those who enjoy classical music. Please come and bring your families and friends. Concert admission is \$8 for Lyceum and Sacred Heart of Jesus family members, Lyceum students and all children under 12 years of age are FREE.
